

2 Peter 1:13 NIV

A pole-vaulter only discovers how high he can jump when he clears the bar. Then he sets it higher. God does that too. He stretches your faith

to what seems like your breaking point. Pastor and author Jon Walker says: 'At one point I sensed God stretching my faith. Specifically, He told me to stop receiving a regular payslip and start living by faith...So with radiant certainty that God would provide because He told me He would, I did what He said and started looking for His provision. I kept a log of every way God took care of me, and the list grew joyfully impressive. God was moving me from a tentative "I hope it will happen," to a certain "I know this will happen." Yet within months I was literally staggered with doubt. I'd lost my focus...and started scrambling for ways to generate income...believing it was my responsibility to make things happen because God may or may not come through...You may be further along than I am in learning to trust God; then again, you may have experienced exactly what I'm describing.' Understand this: a faith that cannot be shaken comes only from a faith that has been so severely shaken that it is now sure, certain, and steadfast. Our greatest concern is getting our needs met, but God's greatest concern is developing our faith. 'Without faith it is impossible to please God' (Hebrews 11:6 NIV 2011 Edition). That's why Peter wrote, 'I will always remind you of these things, even though you know them and are firmly established in the truth...It is right to refresh your memory' (2 Peter 1:12-13 NIV 2011 Edition). So, keep reminding yourself that God is faithful. (UCB.CO.UK)

We don't do any of this in our own strength but in the strength God provides. We can all be involved in the outworking of our mission plan. We can pray and we can be involved in new initiatives and in the expansion of current activities.

As we move forward I pray we will all catch a sense of vocation and vision around our mission plan. Jesus charged the disciples with mission, these are the words he said to them after his resurrection:

"Jesus, undeterred went right ahead and gave this charge: God authorized and commanded me to commission you; go out and train everyone you meet far and near, in this way of life...... I'll be with you as you do this, day after day, right up to the end of the age." (Matthew 28v20 The Message)



May God bless each one of us as we continue to love God, serve people and change lives in this place. Amen

Methodist Church launches new evangelism and growth team

The Methodist Church has announced a new team that will encourage growth and confidence within the Church. The team will focus on supporting the Methodist Church's network of 4,650 churches through promoting everyday evangelism, helping churches reach out into their local communities, and starting new churches.

The calling of the Methodist Church is to respond to the gospel of God's love in Christ and to live out its discipleship in worship and mission. This new team is part of the Methodist Church's response to God and to the cultural and demographic shifts within society. Facing a declining membership along with other denominations, the Methodist Church wants to connect with people who are currently unaffiliated to faith or exploring spirituality in different ways.

New roles have been created to work alongside leaders across the Methodist Church and with its ecumenical partners. The emerging strategy promises innovation, experimentation and adventure with its intention to develop hundreds of 'new places for new people' and to help existing churches come alive and grow.

Leading the team is Trey Hall, the new Director of Evangelism and Growth at the Methodist Church, who began creating the team after he started work in the late summer of 2018. Trey commented: "I am absolutely delighted to welcome these gifted folks to the team.

"We want to take some joyous risks in evangelism and growth as we learn to speak and live out God's goodness in honest, inclusive, and culturally compelling ways. This will certainly be a challenge, but it's a challenge that will build up life, creativity, and energy ahead as we seek to live out our calling!"

Methodist leaders and Archbishop of Canterbury call for end to anger and vitriol in public debate

The President of the Methodist Conference, the Revd Michaela Youngson, and the Vice-President, Mr Bala Gnanapragasam, met with the Archbishop of Canterbury at Lambeth Palace on Wednesday 9 January. The meeting discussed progress on the Anglican-Methodist Covenant and closer working and understanding in mission and evangelism between the two Churches.

As part of the conversation, those present reflected on the current political situation in Britain. Following this discussion, the Archbishop, the President and Vice-President have made the following joint statement:

"Jesus calls us to love one another, and even to love our enemies. In this time of political turmoil we have been shocked at the anger and vitriol that has surrounded so much public discourse, personally, online and via social media. Our Christian heritage, along with other global faith and non-faith traditions, calls for us to treat others as we would wish to be treated. This does not mean the absence of passionate difference, but it does call for respect for human dignity."
